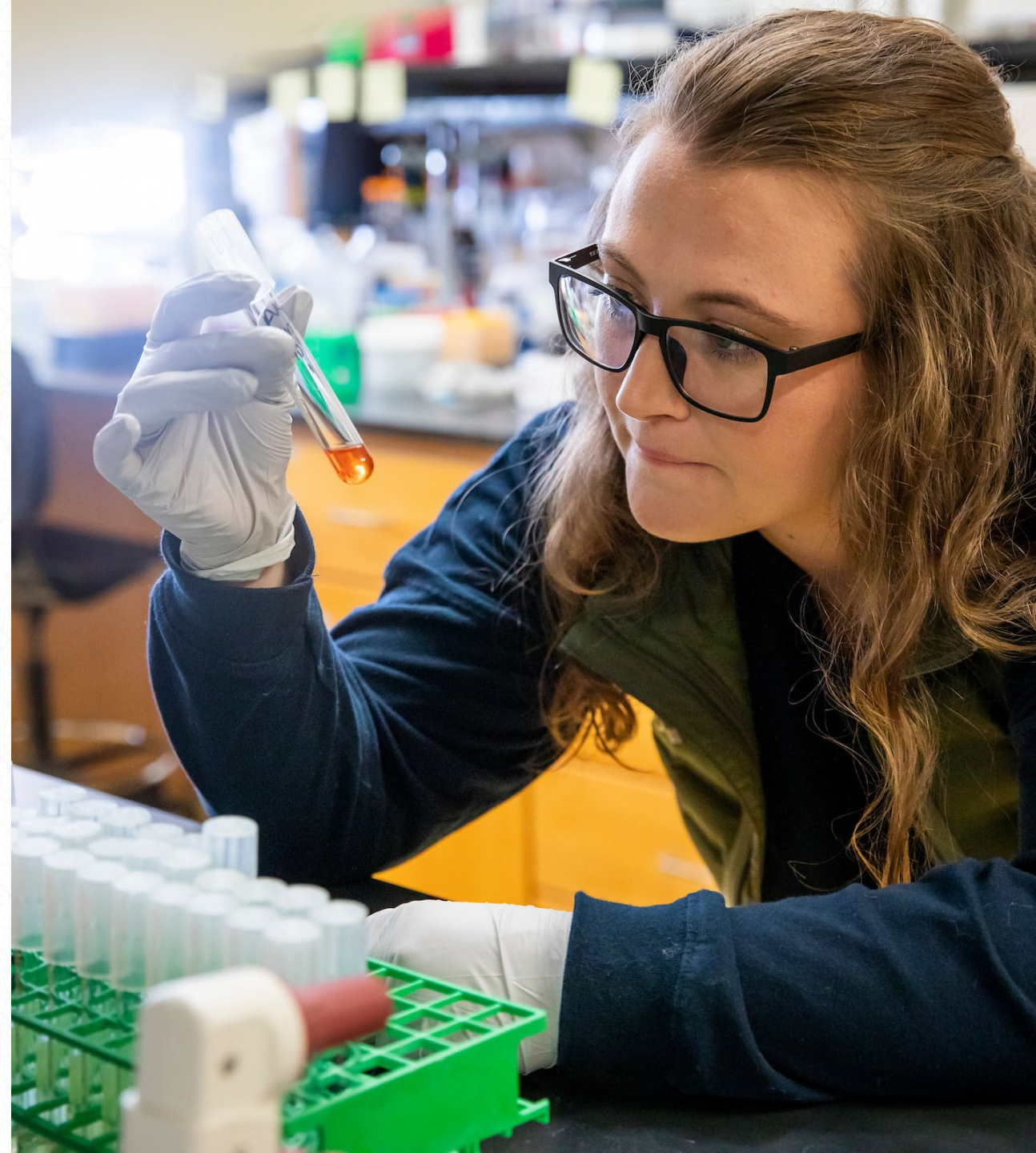


What to Expect

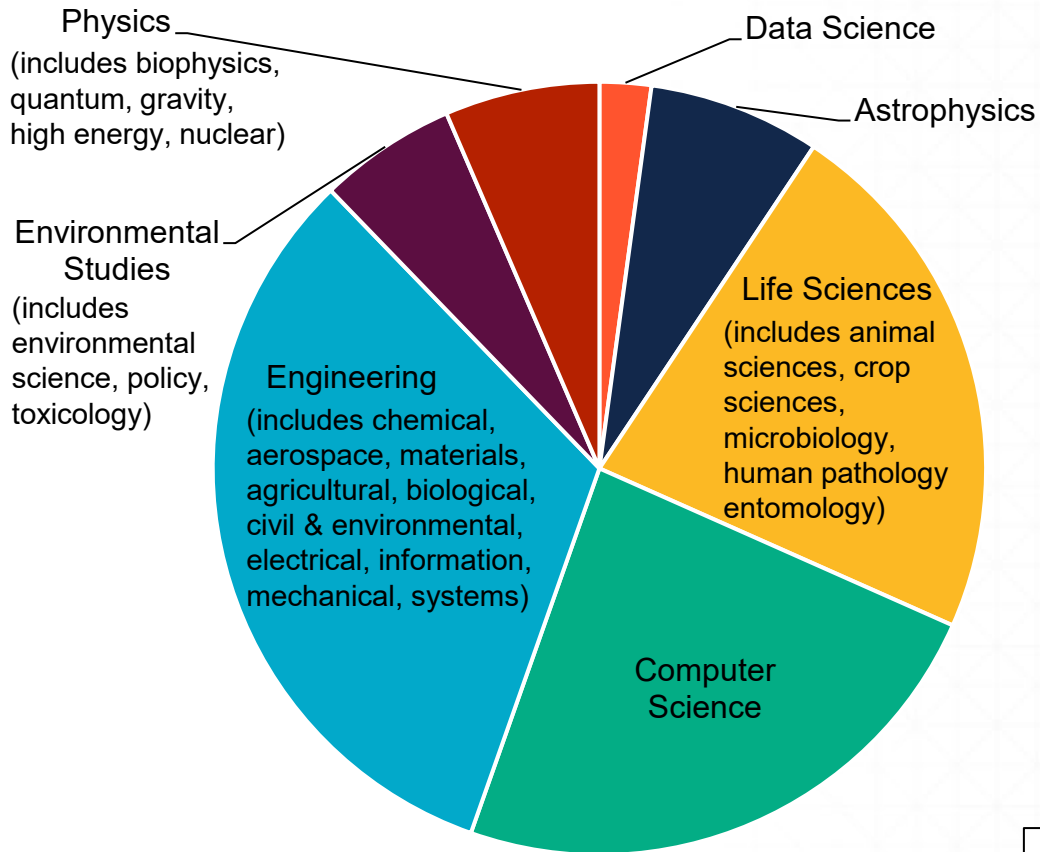

STEM Disciplines*



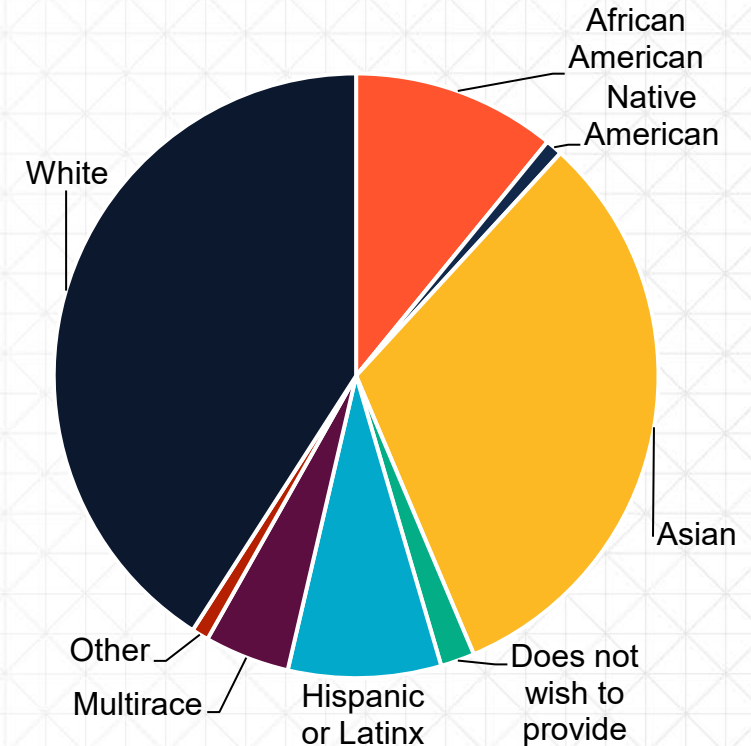
